- 1,500 stall parking garage
- Public art
- Multi-modal hub
- Covered bicycle storage
- Passenger drop-off/pick-up area
- Bus layover area



South Bellevue Park-and-Ride Closure


- South Bellevue Park-and-Ride will close as early as January 2017
- Closure to last up to five years
- Sound Transit's contractor will use the park-and-ride site to stage equipment and materials for building the light rail track, South Bellevue Station and a parking garage.
- Bus stop access to be maintained on Bellevue Way SE





March 2016

- RT 554 (Issaquah to Seattle) added 12 peak trips
- RT 542 (Redmond to UW Station) added 20 new trips
- RT 541 (Overlake to UW Station) 44 new trips

September 2016

- RT 545 (Redmond to Seattle) added 15 new trips
- RT 560 bypasses South Bellevue
- RT 555 and 556 moved from 112th to Bellevue Way

King County Metro Routes

- KCM 241 and 249 continue to serve Bellevue Way

VanShare


- Start a VanShare Today!
